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WATER FACILITIES

Direct pressure system of water works owned and operated by the city; installed in 1871. Water supply from White River pumped by two Holly pumps (14x28x24) one of three million galls., the other, five million galls.; capacity per 24 hours, with 16" and 20" suction mains and discharging into 20" main.

Number of miles of water pipes is not known, but diameters range from 4" to 20". 45 single and 110 double hydrants. Domestic pressure 60 lbs. Fire pressure 100 lbs. per sq. inch. Average daily consumption 2½ million galls.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

One chief. Seven paid men. 19 volunteers. Seven horses. Two hose houses. Gamewell fire alarm system, 28 boxes in streets and two in factories, connecting with both hose houses and with water works. Fire alarm whistle on water works and bells at hose houses.

HOSE HO. NO. 1.— Four paid men. Five horses. Two horse wagons, one with 1300 ft. the other with 700 ft of 2½" cotton, rubber lined hose in good condition. One combination hook & ladder truck and chemical wagon with 40 gall. tank and 200 ft. 1" hose. 1600 ft. 2½" cotton, rubber lined hose in reserve.

HOSE HQ. NO. 2-Three paid men. Two horses. One hose wagon with 1250 ft. 2½" cotton, rubber lined hose in good condition. 700 ft. 2½" cotton, rubber lined hose in reserve.

Grades level. Three miles of improved streets and 54 miles graded and graveled. Public lights electric.
